- In force since 1 October 2016
- Applies to all doctoral students that apply for "doktorand" status after 1 October
- Existing doktoranden can choose

What's New?

New items compared to the old PhD regulations:

- supervision agreement (Betreuungsvereinbarung) between candidate and supervisor (§4).
- After 2 years the supervisor checks whether the PhD thesis should be continued (§6.9).
- The thesis can be a monograph (Monographie) or a cumulative thesis (kumulative Dissertation) (§8).

1) Admission as "Doktorand"

- Apply informally to the doctoral examination board (Promotionsausschuss) according to §6:
- Fill out supervision agreement together with your supervisor
- Template will be available from http://www.tf.uni-freiburg.de/
- Confirm that you have read:
- Rules about scientific honesty (Redlichkeit in der Wissenschaft).
 Link is on Web-page.
- The doctoral examination board (Promotionsausschuss) will decide about the admission and inform the candidate.

2) During thesis work

- Supervision agreement requires regular official meetings with supervisor(s), at least once per year.
- (re)discuss timeline and plan for thesis
- update supervision agreement (Betreuungsvereinbarung)

- After 2 years the supervisor will check whether the thesis should be continued
- and inform the doctoral examination board (Promotionsausschuss) in writing.



- 2 types of thesis (§8)
- Monograph
- Cumulative thesis (to be approved by Promotionsausschuss)

Cumulative thesis

- Requirements for cumulative thesis:
 - Papers published or accepted in refereed journals (Informatik: internationally recognized conferences),
 - Substantial contributions to at least three of the published papers
 - Extensive summary chapter

If papers in a cumulative thesis are not single-authored (§7.1 at end)

 Obtain coauthorship statements that explain the individual contribution of the doktorand

4) Hand-in thesis and request examination

- Hand-in thesis with informal application (§7)
- discuss with supervisor
 - which doctoral degree to apply for
 - Suitable examiners for thesis review and oral exam

5) Oral exam

 Members of the university may attend the oral exam, but the candidate can ask to exclude them. Further guests (e.g., family, friends) can be admitted.

- The exam has 2 parts:
- Presentation of the thesis (20 min)
- Questions to thesis and nearby fields (ca. 70 min)

6) Publication of the thesis

- Standard way to publish the thesis (§13):
- Examining board can request changes in the thesis
- Supervisor has to confirm final version of thesis for publication
- Hand-in 3 paper copies
- Electronic publishing on the FreiDok Server
